
Finally in December we'll be able to socialize and enjoy a gift exchange at our annual holiday party. I look forward to sharing all of these events with you.

Lap	45-60" W x 65-76" L
Twin	54-68" W x 84-100" L
Double	70-84" W x 80-100" L
Queen	76-90" W x 90-108" L
King	92-108" W x 90-108" L
California King	100-114 W x 102-116" L

She often would see me struggle to rip out my own work, and she would always reach over to do that part, then "put it back to where it was" but no further, so I could still take credit for doing the whole project!

Maintaining Membership

Each member of Great South Bay Quilters is required to attend a minimum number of 5 meetings per year. In addition, dues for the year are \$25, payable at the first yearly meeting in September. Members are also required to create either a lap quilt, veteran quilt, or baby quilt as part of their community service requirement. Quilts must be submitted before the end of the year (June).

As the success of the Guild and its activities are reliant on its individuals' participation, all members are strongly encouraged to take an active role by volunteering to serve as officers and/or chairs of Guild committees.

If at any time a member is unable to fulfill any of these requirements, the member should inform the President and special exemptions can be granted (due to personal or family illness, other extenuating circumstances, etc.)

This past week Joann I., Audrey C., former member Liz S. and Joan D. got together and cut up enough batting for all of the participants in the October 9 baby quilt workshop. The roll is 96" x 30 yards so we should have enough for awhile.

Recipe: **Yummy Pumpkin Muffins (perfect for the Thanksgiving table!)**





2 cups all-purpose flour	1 tsp ground cinnamon	2 eggs, lightly beaten
3/4 cup brown sugar, packed	1/4 tsp ground ginger	1/2 cup butter, melted
2 tsp baking powder	1/8 tsp ground cloves	1/4 cup buttermilk
1/4 tsp baking soda	1/8 tsp ground nutmeg	2 tsp vanilla extract
1/2 tsp salt	1 cup canned unsweetened pumpkin puree	


1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees. 2. Grease or place paper muffin cups in a 12-cup muffin tin. 3. Mix the flour, brown sugar, baking powder, baking soda, salt, cinnamon, ginger, cloves and nutmeg together in a mixing bowl. 4. Beat the canned pumpkin, eggs, butter, buttermilk, and vanilla together in another large mixing bowl. Gradually beat in the flour mixture until well blended. 5. Spoon batter into muffin tins about 3/4 full. 6. Bake in preheated oven until a toothpick inserted in the middle of a muffin comes out clean, 20-25 minutes. Cool 3 minutes before turning out from pan. Serve warm or at room temperature.
