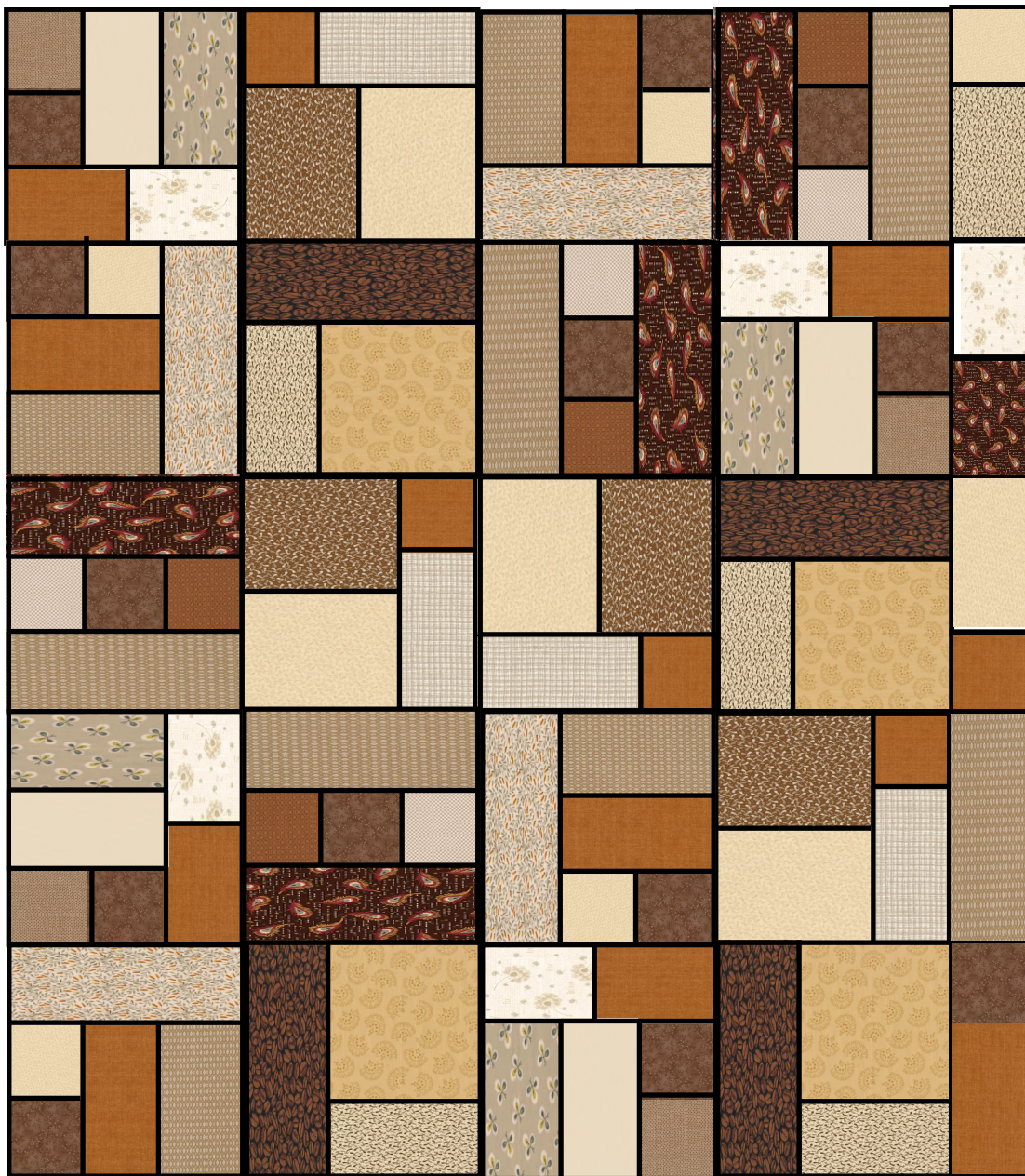


WONDER BLOCK VETERANS QUILT WORKSHOP (52" x 60")

Adapted from the book Wonder Blocks: Stack, Cut, Sew, and Go by Terry Martin



Fabric:

Assorted fabrics for blocks: app. 3 1/2 yards total

Backing: 3 yards 44" fabric

1 1/2 yards extra wide fabric (over 64")

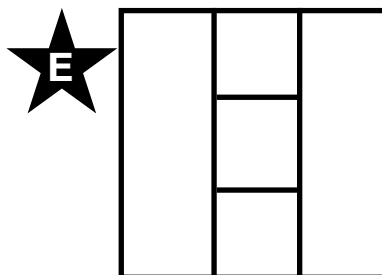
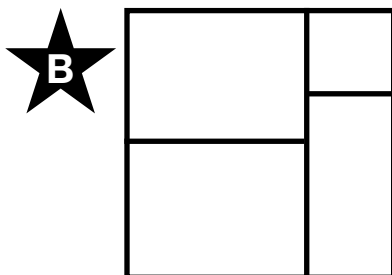
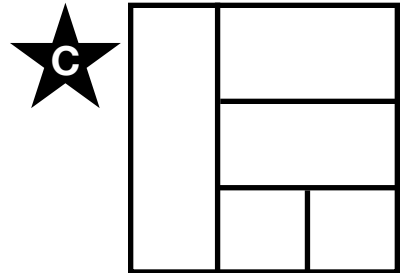
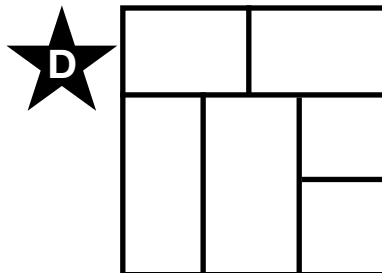
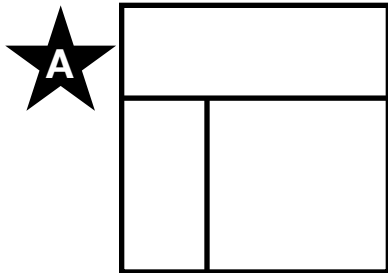
Binding: 1/2 yard 44" fabric

You will be making five (5) types of blocks: A, B, C, D, and E.

You will be making four (4) of each of those blocks for a total of 20 blocks.

You will also be making an extra strip of 4 1/2" pieces to make the quilt to the size required.

These blocks have been chosen to make putting the blocks together as simple and easy as possible... no seams need to be nested or pressed a certain way until you sew the rows together!



You will need to cut pieces in the following amounts and sizes: This whole quilt will have 101 pieces. It is recommended you use a minimum of 11 fabrics.

NOTE: Do NOT cut all the pieces of one size from one color!!! This is very hard to avoid if you are used to cutting a LOT of pieces at one time for other quilts.

Squares

(4) 8 1/2" squares (1) of each of four colors

(35) 4 1/2 " squares MINIMUM of (7) of each of five colors

4 1/2" Rectangles

(17) 12 1/2" x 4 1/2" MINIMUM (9) of one color and (8) of another

(27) 8 1/2" x 4 1/2" MINIMUM: (9) of one color, (9) of another, and (9) of a third color

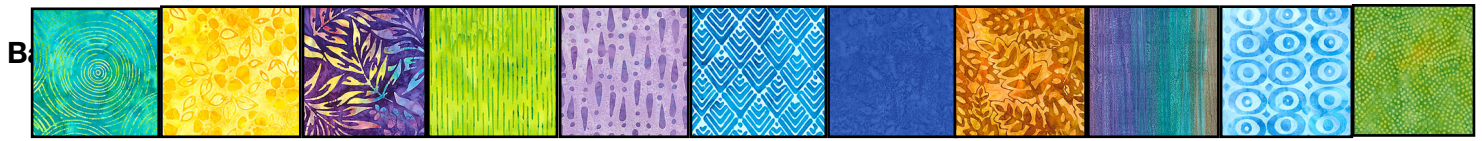
) 6 1/2" x 4 1/2" MINIMUM: (5) of one color and (5) of another

Other Rectangles

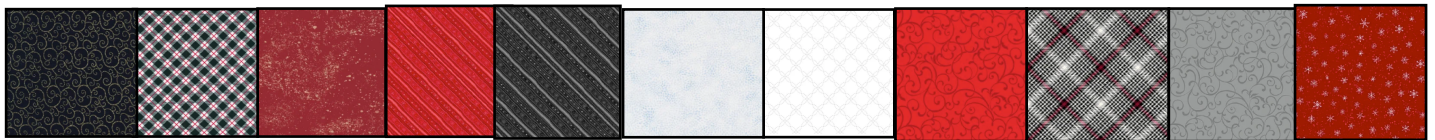
(8) 8 1/2" x 6 1/2" MINIMUM: (4) of one color and (4) of another color

This is a VERY scrap friendly pattern. Suggested scrap palettes: If you have 92 different fabrics, go for it! Remember, the fewer colors you use, the more you have to pay attention to incorporating lights and darks for contrast.

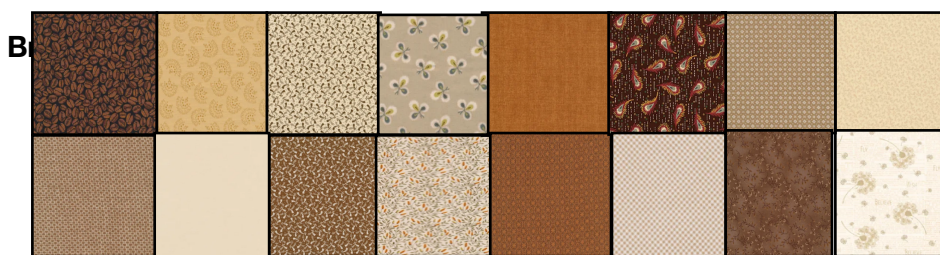
A complete cutting list by color is on the last page, if you are more comfortable with a strict cutting list.



Red/White/Grey/Black:

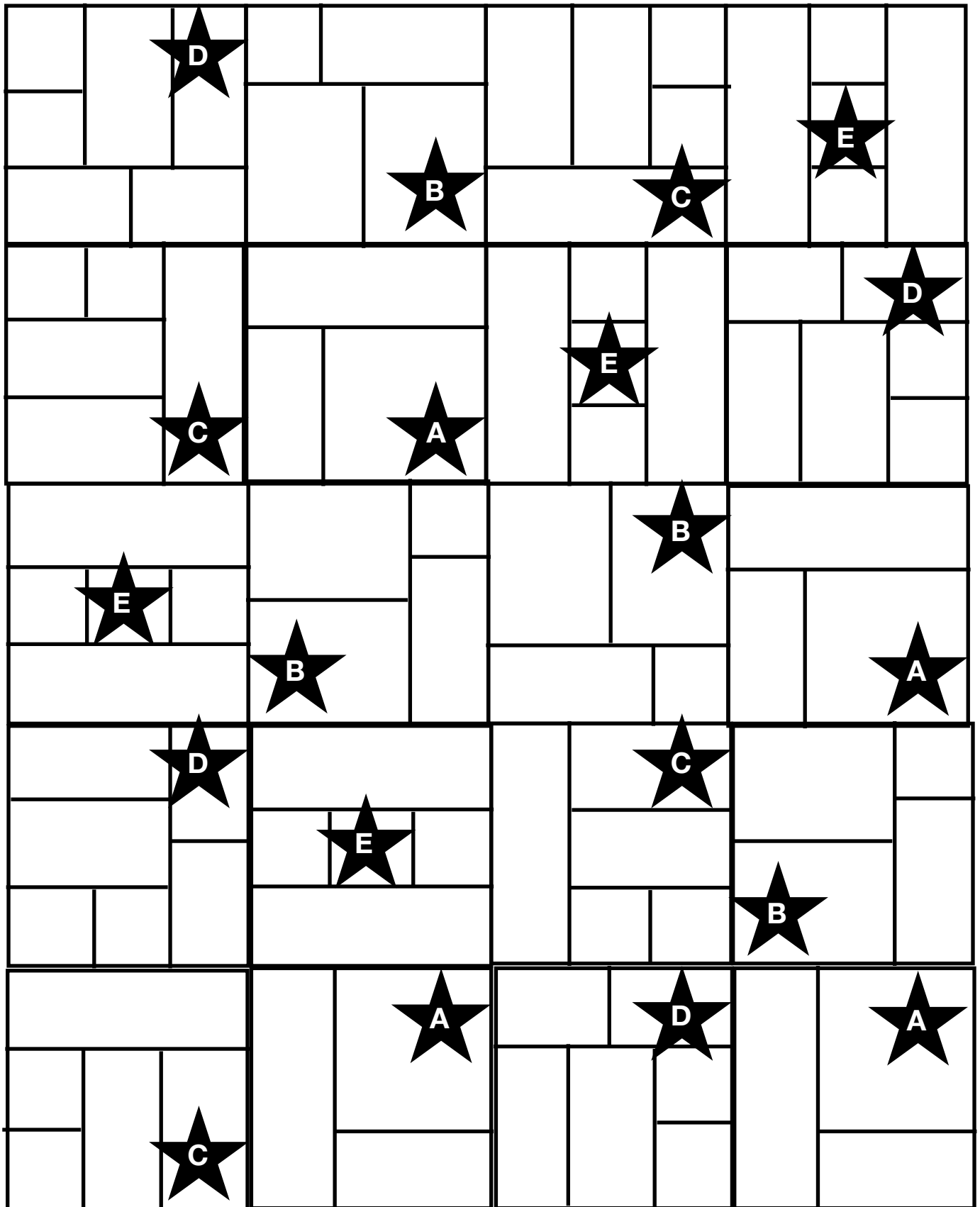


Blue/White:



Layout

Some blocks may be oriented in different directions. This is to make sewing the blocks together as easy as possible, with no seam matching except for joining the rows together.



Color 1 (1/2 yard)

(4) 8 1/2" squares

(11) 4 1/2" squares

Color 2 (1/3 yard)

(4) 8 1/2" x 6 1/2" Rectangles

(11) 4 1/2" squares

Color 3 (1/4 yard)

(13) 4 1/2" squares

Color 4 (3/8 yard)

(9) 12 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles

Color 5 (3/8 yard)

(8) 12 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles

Color 6 (1/4 yard)

(9) 8 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles

Color 7 (1/4 yard)

(9) 8 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles

Color 8 (1/4 yard)

(9) 8 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles

Color 9 (1/4 yard)

(4) 8 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles

Color 10 (1/8 yard)

(5) 6 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles
